"I'm happy that the food [pantry] gives out healthy food," she said. "The things I get are very nutritious. I get low-salt mixed veggies. I have high blood pressure, so it really, really helps."

Donors "Stuff the Bean" to Help Fill Summer Food Gap MEND launched its new mobile food pantry, The Green Bean, earlier this year, and has now scheduled several "Stuff the Bean" food collection events to collect more fresh and healthy food for those in need.

Summer is a particularly difficult time of year for many families, because they lose access to Federal schoolbased feeding programs during the break. MEND's *Summer Hunger Busters* program provides more childfriendly, nutritious foods to its pantries, to help fill the summer food gap.

The Green Bean's first stop was Tuscan Elementary School in Maplewood. There, students toured the bus, and collected 900 pounds of healthy needed foods. Next was a "Meet the Green Bean" event at the South Orange Public Library, to celebrate Opening Day for the library's teen volunteers' summer reading program and kick off the teen's annual summer food drive.
