food into the bus. The food
will benefit the OLS Food Pantry in
South Orange.

Next, <u>JLOSH</u> and MEND partnered for the <u>Orange Public School District's</u> first annual Parent Conference on December 1st. There, JLOSH volunteers engaged the kids in activities and crafts - including a *Green Bean* scavenger hunt - while parents attended workshops on topics like, "how to build a home library," and "social emotional learning." 75 families received bags of fresh produce to take home after the event.

## Addressing Senior Hunger

On an October morning, six volunteers from the St. Joseph's Church food pantry in Maplewood packed their trunks with grocery bags and caravanned a few blocks to Nora Gardens, an affordable apartment building for seniors.

Inside, they scattered, announcing themselves with cheerful knocks as they left bags filled with staples – pasta and sauce, soup and beans – for residents in the building.

The door-to-door delivery has long been part of the pantry's program, serving roughly 55 seniors each month.

"The need has always been there," said Don Blaesser, who cofounded the pantry in 1999 with his wife Lynne.

According to Feeding America, a network of food pantries across the U.S, more than five million people over the age of 60 struggle with food insecurity. Since 2001, the rate of hunger among this population has increased by 45 percent.
